## CRIME SURPRESSION DECREASE in MAJOR VIOLENT CRIME (2018-2019)

- Murder (-50%) (4 to 2)
- Aggravated Assault-Shootings (-63%)
- Weapons Offenses/Shots Fired (-84%)
- Weapons Offenses/Arrests (+68%)
- Assaults (Other) (-4%)
- Robbery (+6%)

*In 2019 officers averaged 526 FOOT PATROLS and 1,728 DESIGNATED Property Checks MONTHLY! This represents a 53% INCREASE in FOOT PATROLS and 41% INCREASE in Property Checks since 2015*

## KEY BUDGETARY GOALS - 2020

- Safety & Security of Municipal Complex: (Federal Forfeiture Funds) Est. \$70,000
- **Police Vehicle Replenishment (Marked) (3)**
  - Six (6) VEHICLES in excess of 100,000 miles!
  - Five (3) of those (6) VEHICLES in excess of 125,000 miles!
  - Two (1) of those (3) in excess of 140,000 miles!
- **Police Vehicle Purchase (Un-Marked): Criminal Investigation Bureau**
  - REPLACED three (1) in 2019
  - Purchased two (used) unmarked vehicles from Cumberland County Prosecutor's Office
  - Four (5) of (14) un-marked detectives vehicles OVER 100,000 miles.
- **Maintain and/or reduce ALL other Operating Budgetary Line Items**
  - Absent cost increases.
- **Facility**
  - Sliding File Storage (Records); AED Unit – Municipal Complex; Language Line (Dispatch)
- **Mobile (Vehicle) Police Radios:**
  - Gradually replenish the marked fleet with 700 MHZ radios.



## KEY BUDGETARY GOALS - 2020

- MDT (Vehicle PCs) Warranty (\$15,000)
- WatchGuard Body Worn and Vehicle Camera System Warranties (\$12,300)

- IA Pro Maintenance/Warranty/Licensing (\$1,400)
- Language Line (Interpretation) (\$1,000)
- LIVESCAN (Fingerprint System) Fee (\$3,600)
- ALPR (Automated License Plate Reader) (\$2,500)
- State of New Jersey Radio Frequency Payment (\$4,000)
- AFIX Tracker (Fingerprint) State of New Jersey Fee (\$6,500)

**2020 Budget Requests \$6,000 LESS than 2019!**



# 2020 Budget Expenditures Overview

## Training

- Software to provide on-duty fire and ems training to personnel, avoiding overtime
- Props to be built to facilitate practical training. (materials only, staff constructed)
- Specialized training programs (recent Cooper Hospital partnership, free training)

## Maintenance- Required maintenance/testing

- Hose/Pump/Ladder Testing
- Fleet Maintenance
- SCBA Testing/Certification

## Turnout Gear

- NFPA dictates life of safety equipment/turnout gear
  - Capital has not been needed due to departmental replacement program in place
- Regular rotation avoids long term capital cost

## Clothing/Uniforms

- Contractual/Firefighters require specialized material for their uniforms

Buildings- Old, unsuited, outdated buildings pressed into modern use. Costly to maintain.

Built in 1898

Apparatus bays added 1975

Built in 1877 (former Water Dept.)
