Administrator reported City received Green Acres Funding that we applied for in the amount of \$400,000 which will gp back into our Park Bond Fund.

Administrator informed Council the bid threshold has increased to \$40,000 for our QPA and quotes threshold to \$6,000.

Administrator stated that the Road Program is almost complete and we approximately \$24,000 left over. The proposal is to finish the north end of the Raceway at no charge change order with Ricky Slade, the additional paving already under the existing contract. Council agreed upon..

Clerk announced Alcoholic Beverage Licensees reports have been distributed and all Tax Clearance Certificates have been received and all fees paid. A resolution will be on at next meeting for renewal and if any should are not

to be included she should be informed. It was agreed to hold renewals for discussion during executive session under Public Safety.
